The meeting was called to order at 2:10 PM.

Minutes of Nov. 14, 2012 were approved with revisions.

In preparation for the upcoming special faculty meeting to discuss the proposed revision to the CompE curriculum, the chair asked for suggestions on how to present the subject. The following were offered:

- Arrange pre-meetings with interrested groups, especially those doing physical electronics and Electromagnetics/Optics.
- A Explain the motivation for this proposal.
- A Highlight the differences between CS and CompE.
- A Note the necessity to consider both faculty judgments and students preferences.
- △ Outline the results of the Alumni Survey on this and related subjects.

Undergraduate mentoring is a responsibility that ECE takes very seriously. This year it has become more time consuming as faculty typically had thirty advising appointments each. The question was raised by Andreas whether there is some way to make the process more efficient and effective. The specific proposal was to do group advising at a lunchtime meeting. It was agreed that such a method could be made to work but several critical issues would have to be addressed, namely:

- ▲ Group meetings can't be used to address the diverse needs of individuals
- A There are privacy issues that make the discussion of some topics impossible in a group. Perhaps some faculty training would be required to address these issues.
- ▲ The scheduling of group meetings would have to be implemented in the existing online advising calendar. Possibly only one out of two annual meetings should be in small groups of 5 or six students.
- ▲ Group advising might make necessary post registration reviews of individual students progress.
- ▲ We already have "power lunches" for student/faculty socialization. These activities may be orthogonal to the purposes of our advising methods which seem to be quite effective as they are.

The chair will send out by e-mail to all committee members the complete Alumni Survey and the CompE revised curriculum proposal.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:55 PM.
